#### **Common Legal Questions for Older Adults**

#### What is a Will?

A will is a legal document that directs where you want your property to go at your death. Any person over the age of 18 of sound mind may make a will.

#### What happens if I die without a Will?

If someone passes without a will, property is distributed through the laws of intestate succession to your heirs in the order that your state's laws direct.

#### What is a Living Will?

A living will is a legal document that allows you to control the decision about whether your life should be prolonged by certain medical procedures if you are suffering from one of three conditions:

- 1. Incurable or irreversible condition;
- 2. Unconsciousness, and to a high degree of medical certainty you will not regain consciousness; or
- 3. Advanced dementia or another condition which results in a substantial loss of cognitive ability and to a high degree of medical certainty the loss is not reversible.

#### What are Advanced Directives?

Advanced directives are legal documents that help you and your loved ones make decisions if/when you are unable to do so, including Powers of Attorney, Health Care Powers of Attorney, and Living Wills.

#### What is a Power of Attorney?

A Power of Attorney is legal document in which you give someone (known as your agent) the legal authority to take certain actions for you regarding financial decisions.

#### When does a Power of Attorney go into effect?

A Durable Power of Attorney, according to the 2018 North Carolina Uniform Power of Attorney Act, goes into effect immediately and remains in effect during incapacity or incompetence. A Springing Power of Attorney is effective only once the person becomes incapacitated or incompetent.

#### What powers can I give my Power of Attorney agent?

You can give your agent power over any of the following: Real Property; Tangible Personal Property; Stocks and Bonds; Commodities and Options; Banks and Other Financial Institutions; Operation of Entity or Business; Insurance and Annuities; Estates, Trusts, and Other Beneficial Interests; Claims and Litigation; Personal and Family Maintenance; Benefits from Governmental Programs or Civil or Military Service; Retirement Plans; Taxes; All preceding subjects

#### What is a Health Care Power of Attorney?

A Health Care Power of Attorney is a legal document in which you give someone the power to make medical decisions for you if you are not competent or if you are not able to communicate your wishes.

#### When does a Health Care Power of Attorney come into effect?

A Health Care Power of Attorney comes into effect only when a physician you have named or your attending physician (if the one that you have named is not available) determines that you lack capacity to make or communicate decisions relating to your health care, unless your Health Care Power of Attorney agreement states otherwise.

#### What authority does my Health Care Power of Attorney agent have?

The Health Care Power of Attorney Agent has the ability to make and carry out all health care decisions and mental health decisions for you, unless you limit their ability

If the steps are cracked or broken, call the county government about repairing them.</li> <li>Make sure you have someone around to shovel the snow and ice in the driveway. Always keep a bag of salt to avoid icy driveways.</li> <li>A device that enables a ringing doorbell to trigger a flashing light can help your loved one know that someone is at the door.</li> </ol>	1. Organization is the key to preventing too much clutter. It may be time to downsize and eliminate bigger pieces of furniture. You could also add shelving.  2. If the arms or legs of furniture are wobbly-try gluing them. If the chair is too low add a cushion or pillow on seat to raise it.  3. If your loved one cannot reach the light add a "clapper" light  4. Remove throw rugs.  5. Install lock in switches on thermostats to control the temperature and prevent forest fires.

<ol> <li>Go through items and throw away what is no longer needed/wanted to get rid of clutter.</li> <li>Keep a cordless phone or cellphone beside the bed for convenience.</li> <li>Nightlights are good options for dark rooms at night. Make sure the wattage is high enough to provide visibility. Rope lighting is also a good option for hallways and doorways.</li> <li>The bed is too low if your loved one's knees are above the hips when sitting on the bed. You can add risers. If the bed is too high when legs do not touch the floor. You can remove the bed frame or use a lower profile mattress or bed springs</li> <li>Use extension cords to run electrical cords behind furniture</li> <li>Make sure chairs are the proper height</li> </ol>	1. Increase wattage to allowable limits and add overhead and wall lighting, if necessary.  2. Add at least 1 railing the entire length of the wall. Ideally, there should be railing on both sides.  3. Add adhesive stair treads or a carpet runner.  4. Paint the bottom steps a different color from the floor.  5. Immediately clean up spills and wear shoes/socks with non-skid soles on them.  6. If possible, move the laundry to the main living area-if not, lock the door if your loved one wanders or is at risk for falls.
